## What's New on RockRiverHOG.com Your Chapter Website Just Got a Major Upgrade

If you haven't visited rockriverhog.com lately, now is a great time to check it out. Over the past several months, your chapter website has received a significant overhaul, new features, tighter security, and much improved experience for members. Here's a rundown of what's new.

### Members-Only Area

The Members Only section of the site reserved exclusively for Rock River H.O.G. members. Once you enter the chapter password, you'll find everything in one place:

- Rock Wisconsin, details of our multi-day ride across the great state of Wisconsin
- Flat Rocker, the chapter's rider activity program, all in one spot
- Newsletters, past issues of the chapter newsletter, available anytime
- Chapter Calendar, a live, up-to-date Google Calendar embedded right on the page, so you never miss a ride or event
- Chapter Contacts, quick-reference cards with names and email addresses for every chapter officer

***Don't have the password yet? Reach out to any chapter officer.***

### Stay Connected, Email Updates from the Chapter

Members can now sign up to receive chapter alert emails directly through the Members Area. Just enter your name and email address in the "Stay Connected" card, and you'll receive important chapter alerts, things like last-minute ride changes, weather cancellations, and time-sensitive announcements straight to your inbox.

Only members who are logged into the Members Area can sign up, and you can unsubscribe just as easily anytime you'd like. Officers can send chapter-wide alert emails directly from the site.

### Push Notifications, Ride Alerts on Your Phone

Want to know the moment a new ride or announcement drops? The site now supports browser push notifications. Click "Allow" when prompted and you'll receive instant alerts, even when you're not on the site. It works on both Android and iPhone (via Safari on iOS 16.4+).

Important: Push notifications must be enabled on each device you want to receive them on. If you want alerts on both your phone and your laptop, visit the Members Area on each device and allow notifications separately.

Officers can send a push notification to all subscribed members with just a few clicks, making it easier than ever to get the word out fast when plans change or a spontaneous ride comes together.

### Live Announcements Board

The Members Area homepage now features a live announcements board, a pinned section at the top of the page where officers can post timely chapter news. Announcements appear immediately and can include links to events, rides, or other resources. Check it each time you visit to stay in the loop.

### Your Next Meeting, Always Up to Date

Both the public homepage and the Members Area now display your next chapter meeting date automatically, calculated in real time so you never have to wonder when the next 3rd Tuesday falls. The date updates itself every month without anyone having to touch the site.

### Release Forms and Chapter Documents, Right There When You Need Them

All the forms you need for chapter events are now available for download directly from the Members Area:

- Harley-Davidson Enrollment & Release Form
- Adult Chapter Event Release Form
- Minor Chapter Event Release Form
- Minors Assumption of Risk (2026 edition)
- Group Riding Policies
- Rock River Membership Form

### Behind the Scenes: Security & Performance

Beyond what you can see, several important improvements were made under the hood:

Security, the site now uses industry-standard security headers to protect against common web vulnerabilities. The Firebase database that powers real-time features is locked down so that only authorized officers can write announcements or manage member data. All sensitive credentials are encrypted and never stored in plain text.

Speed, Images, calendars, and scripts now load more efficiently, so the site feels faster on both desktop and mobile. The chapter calendar and photo gallery use lazy-loading, meaning they don't slow down your initial page load.

Mobile-Friendly, every page has been tested and refined for smartphones. Whether you're checking the schedule from the parking lot before a ride or signing up for notifications from your couch, the site works smoothly on any screen size.

# JUNE SAFETY

Hello R.R. Family Members.

It is said in Wisconsin there are 2 seasons - winter and road construction. Well, to be honest, there are a few more. One of them is quite dangerous for us motorcycle enthusiasts. The month of June is the peak time of year for deer motorcycle crashes. Deer are active in Waukesha as fawns are born and yearling deer separate from their mothers. The most active times of day are at dawn and dusk. Deer rarely travel alone. If you see one crossing, assume more will follow. If a collision with a deer is imminent, do not swerve to avoid it. By swerving you run the risk of losing control of your motorcycle and crashing.

Your best option is to stay in your lane and firmly hold on to your handlebars. After the impact, start braking and come to a stop. Check yourself out to make sure you're ok. Put your flashers on and make sure you get to the side of the road. From there you can make any phone calls for help. I hope you never have to deal with hitting a deer with your motorcycle. But if you do, keep calm and keep this advice to help yourself survive.

Sunday, June 21st is Father's Day. If your father is still with us, make sure you take the opportunity to share the day with him. For those of us whose Fathers are in Heaven, remember he is always with you. For all the other dads, I hope your kids spoil you! Happy Father's Day.

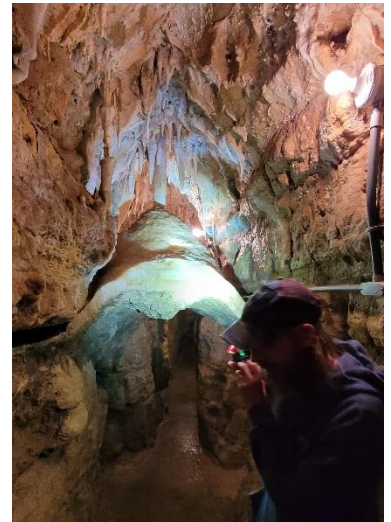
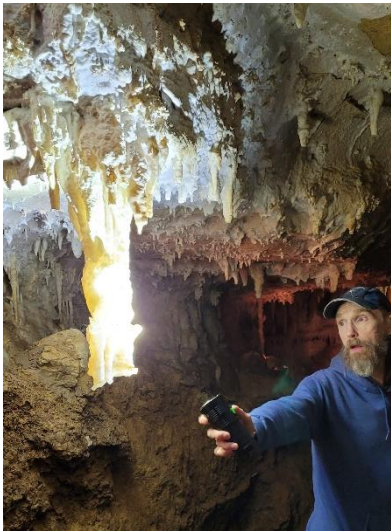

Riding season has begun! Don't forget to stop in at Wisconsin Harley Davidson to get your first/second/third mileage reading of the year. The staff is prepared and ready to help you. Make sure you have downloaded the Harley app using your HOG number, username and password ahead of time.

**Let's Ride Challenge:** The [Let's Ride Challenge® Ride for Heroes](#) brings riders across the country together to log miles in support of a \$1 million donation to organizations supporting active military, veterans and first responders. 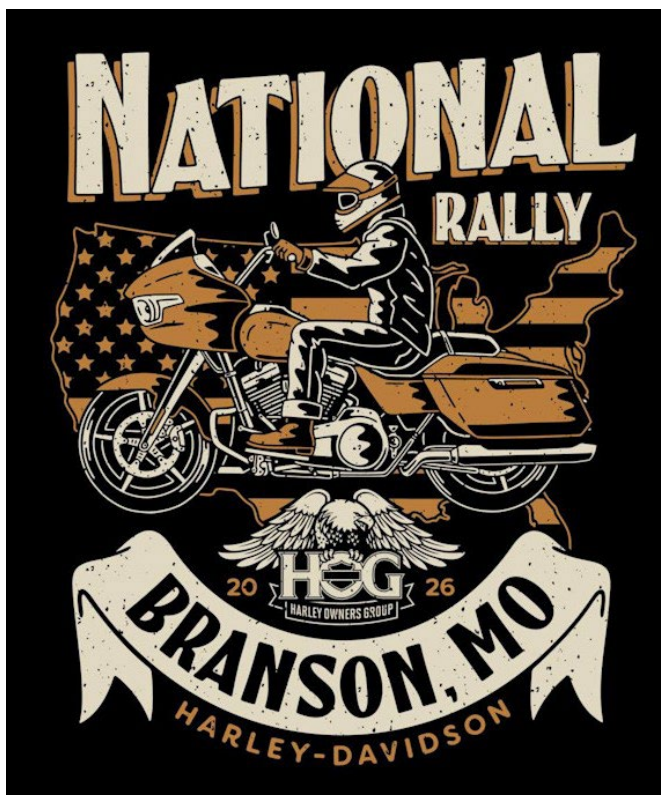
